



CONDITIONAL HISTORIC REGISTRATION

- Conditional Historic Registration provides reduced registration fees for vehicles which are over thirty (30) years old.
- These vehicles are for use, up to ninety (90) days per year, therefore reducing the registration fees payable.





IS YOUR VEHICLE ELIGIBLE FOR CONDITIONAL HISTORIC REGISTRATION?

- Firstly, are you a member of the BMW Drivers Club of South Australia, with ownership of a BMW?
- If not then Join NOW as you need to be a financial member of our club to qualify.

IMPORTANT: NEW/PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS

- For new members, your application must be received, paid for and approved by the Membership Secretary before anything further can occur.
- You cannot apply for membership, pay your fee and then get conditional historic registration the same day.





JOINING PROCESS

- Familiarise yourself with the principles of the Club and the various levels of membership and the fees applicable.
- From this, scroll down to the lower half of the page, select which membership is most appropriate to you and click the “next” button to initiate the rest of the process. It is quite simple.





VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY

- Is your vehicle over thirty (30) years old in this calendar year?
- Only vehicles with a build date of 1992* or earlier qualify
- If not – it is ineligible
- *as from Jan 2022 on





LEFT HAND DRIVE VEHICLES

- Is your vehicle left hand drive?
- If so, do you have a Left Hand Drive Exemption Certificate?
- If not Please arrange to get a LHD Exemption Certificate with Service SA before applying.





HAS YOUR VEHICLE BEEN MODIFIED?

- Has your vehicle been modified in any way from its original build specification?
- Do you have a Roadworthy Exemption Certificate?
- If not, Please arrange a Compliance or Exemption Certificate with Service SA before applying





MODIFIED VEHICLE

- Do you have a Roadworthy Exemption Certificate?
- If not, Please arrange a Compliance or Exemption Certificate with Service SA before applying.





VEHICLE QUALIFIES FOR CONDITIONAL HISTORIC REGISTRATION

- An MR334 Form can now be issued by a Club Conditional Historic Registration Officer.
- See the Club website (Events) for the next best date and venue for this to be done and register your participation.
 - Have the MR334 Form completed and issued
 - Register your vehicle under the scheme with Service SA
 - Pay for the issue of a Club Registration Logbook
 - Supply a copy of the new “Registration Details Certificate” issued by Service SA to the Conditional Registrations Manager
 - A new logbook will be issued and sent out to you





IMPORTANT INFO

Logbook Validation

- Members must have their logbook revalidated each membership year
- This must be done as you complete the membership renewal process each year.
- This is done by a CHRO by either presenting it in person at an event or Club meeting, Alternatively, the logbook can be mailed to the Club, after which, once signed and stamped, it will be mailed back to you.





IMPORTANT INFO

Unfinancial Member

- When a member becomes unfinancial, they no longer meet one of the criteria for Conditional Historic Registration and the Club will notify DIT/Service SA in writing that this is the case.
- The vehicle previously subject of CHR will then no longer be entitled to concessionary registration.





OTHER INFO

Transferring from one Club to another

- CHRO verifies vehicle and issues new MR334 – even if vehicle is already registered, the owner must lodge a new MR334 with Service SA so the vehicle can be “moved” from the old Club to the new Club.
- New logbook is issued.
- The transferring member must advise their old Club that they are not renewing that membership.





FAQ'S

Who can drive a Conditional Registered Vehicle

- Q: Do you have to be a member of the Club to drive a vehicle on conditional registration?
A: No, any person who holds a valid current licence for that type of vehicle can operate it.

Multiple Drivers

- Q: If you change drivers during the day, does the new driver have to sign the logbook?
A: No, a single entry for that date is all that is required.





FAQ'S

Changing "Information about the Owner and Vehicle

- Q: Can the "information about the Owner and the Vehicle" page in the logbook be changed or must a new logbook be issued?

A: Only the following details can be changed, but only by a Club CHRO:

Residential Address; Engine Number; or
Registration Plate Number can be amended.

Ensure that DIT/Service SA have been notified of the changes first, to ensure logbook details match DIT/Service SA records.
